

Tearfund's Big Quiz Night

Now in its fifth year, Tearfund's Big Quiz Night has raised an amazing £826,000 to help end extreme poverty. Churches Together in Nantwich, thought it would be great idea to host a Quiz and support Tearfund and have a bit of fun! The idea is for quizzes to be hosted up and down the country on the same day, 19th November. The organisation is made easy as Tearfund provide the questions, promotional materials etc. Tickets were distributed throughout the Churches in Nantwich, and we all came together on the 19th November is St Mary's Hall for our quiz. It was felt that an afternoon tea rather than an evening gathering would be better and a little bit different. There were forty "contestants" split into six teams, and the quiz started with four rounds of questions.

At half time there were four teams within three points of each other! We enjoyed a wonderful afternoon tea, consisting of scones, sandwiches, cake and endless cups of tea, all beautifully presented on cake stands. The catering was organised by Gill Appleton, and was a real ecumenical effort, with cakes arriving from different churches!

During tea we heard about Zuleima a 35-year-old mother of three from Venezuela. It is a country struggling beneath the weight of a massive economic crisis. Zuleima would have to queue for up to two days to get into a supermarket and find nothing.

Zuleima shares: "I said to myself: This is not what I want for my children. This is not what I want for myself, for my family". Along with more than a million other Venezuelans, Zuleima made the decision to flee to neighbouring Colombia. [I was] leaving my house, my home, my memories, Zuleima says, "It was very difficult to leave it all behind." On arrival in Colombia, she was supported by Tearfund to start working and earning money to support her family, and she has joined the church community to help others fleeing such a desperate situation. So fundraising campaigns such as this quiz are essential to maintain this work.

After tea was cleared away and the raffle drawn, we started on the second half of the quiz. There were five other rounds and the lead swung between teams, but at the end "Hip, hip, hip hooray" team from the Methodist church were victorious, closely pursued by Acton Acorns. Everyone agreed that it had been an enjoyable experience to have a bit of fun, meet others and of course raise funds. Although the final total at the time of writing has not been finalised it will be around £500. Across the country the total won't be known for a week or so, but it is known that 322 churches took part with 12,920 participants. So do book the date of 18th November 2023 for next years Quiz!

Saint Mary; Mother of Jesus

After the celebration of Christmas, we are soon into the time of Epiphany and think of the wise men offering their gifts. We think of Mary and Joseph as the protective parents for the Son of God, but Mary was probably only about 12 – 14 years of age, too young to bear such a responsibility. Today she is regarded as the Saint above all others and many Christian churches believe that she is the Mother of God. It may come as a surprise to know that in Islam she is said to be the holiest and highest of all women, and has a whole chapter named for her in the Koran. The Gospels and Acts of the Apostles were written between 66 - 110 AD and contain only brief mentions of Mary, focusing on Jesus and his teachings. The writings are known to mix historical detail with legends, but even the Gospel of John does not actually name her, simply calling her the mother of Jesus. Yet she is revered across the world today. alongside her son.

Mary, who's Aramaic name was Maryam, was betrothed to Joseph at about 12 years, her marriage probably planned for about a year later. Her Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel informed her of her miraculous conception and Son, was followed by her Nativity. Joseph and Mary had travelled to Bethlehem to register for a census under the Roman Emperor Augustus. We know little of Mary, and family life, after the birth and presentation of the baby Jesus at the temple of Jerusalem. The family fled to Egypt to avoid King Herod and returned to Nazareth in 4BC when he died, avoiding his son Archelaus who was the ruler of Judea. The next mention of Mary in the Bible is of being separated from Jesus during the Passover celebrations and finding him in the temple with religious teachers when he was about 12 years old. However, Jesus' first miracle appears to have been instigated by Mary, when he was asked to help the family at a wedding in Cana. He turned their water into wine to save the blushes of the father at the wedding party. The Gospels then place Mary at the feet of her son on the Cross. accompanied by Mary Magdalen and Mary of Cleophas [her sister-in-law], at this terrible execution. Better times were to follow, with Mary and the remaining 11 apostles in the upper room of a house after Jesus' Ascension into Heaven. Following Jesus' death, she is said to have lived with John the Evangelist in

Ephesus, a city in Ancient Greece. Her own death was said to be natural, with a burial at the site of the Church of the Sepulchre of St. Mary in the Kidron Valley at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Then her whole body is said to be assumed [taken] into Heaven as the greatest Saint.

Despite knowing little of Mary, her appearance, life and wider family experience, she is represented in our culture at every level. Churches throughout the world are named after her, not least here in Acton and Nantwich. Her life is reflected in sculpture and painting and glittering icons. Today we make films and television programmes of her life and times, this teenage girl from Nazareth, chosen by God.


Smile
