Some people dislike January, not because of the cold weather or dark nights, but because it has 31 days and the money runs out before that! Also, Christmas has been expensive, heating bills are coming in, and it seems that all we can do is hunker down and wait for spring.

Perhaps by the time you read this, the New Year parties will be over, the fireworks from Sydney Harbour Bridge, long gone, and the Black Buns all eaten up north of the border. (Black Bun is a fruit cake, encased in a thin pastry crust and baked for Hogmanay). This all seems rather dispiriting and when we look at the news, things only seem worse - the wars in Gaza, and Lebanon, and Ukraine seem unending, and smaller disputes in Africa take a backseat. Then there is global warming, and an unpredictable future for the Western world with the inauguration of a new and unpredictable president of the United States. To many people all this is true but of no importance as they struggle with their own health, money, family, housing, or employment problems.

Before you turn the page to find relief from all this gloom, remember that the things I have described are not new, that life has always been uncertain. We must remember too, what we celebrated a few days ago - that God sent his only son into the world to be our saviour. In her letter to guests at her Carol Service in Westminster Abbey, the Princess of Wales used the word 'love' 11 times. That is the whole point of Christmas - that God is love and he came to live among us.

We pray to the God of love, for his help, presence and guidance each day, for ourselves and for those beyond our reach and for whom prayer is all we can offer. Then we will find that we are living and believing and joining in with the words of Saint Paul, when he said 'There is nothing in all creation that will ever be able to separate us from the love of God which is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord' I suggested that we learn these verses a year ago, and make no apology for using them again, because they are true!





Jerusalem; A Favourite Hymn

We all know the song 'Jerusalem' from the at many sporting and political gatherings, many events where it is sung and broadcast on the radio, television or even from films and drama programmes such as 'Chariots of Fire'. It was written as a poem by William Blake in 1804 as part of his work about the poet Milton - 'A poem in two books'. It is said that he was inspired by a legend that Iesus accompanied Joseph of Arithamea to England and visited Glastonbury in Somerset, where Joseph is also said to have pushed his staff into the soil where it grew into a tree which still stands today. However, Blake is also said to have had a personal belief that the 'dark Satanic mills' meant that the devil is a miller who grinds human souls!

In 1916 the First World War was certainly grinding human souls and the poet laureate, Robert Bridges, put together a collection of patriotic poems called 'The Spirit of Man' which included 'Jerusalem'. He suggested to Sir Hubert Parry that it could be set to music, and it was first sung at a meeting of the Fight For Right movement, which was formed to boost the morale of soldiers fighting in the trenches. It became the anthem for Fight For Right until Sir Hubert became disillusioned with the politics of the organisation and gave the copyright to Millicent Fawcett of the National Union of Women's Suffrage [NUWS]. Sir Hubert himself conducted Jerusalem at a National Service for Women at the Royal Albert Hall in 1917. It continued its association with women's groups after the NUWS was disbanded when the copyright was reassigned to the Women's Institute. Famously it is still sung at every branch and national meeting of the WI. Jerusalem is not strictly a hymn: it doesn't praise God, but it has become an unofficial second National anthem, played

usually to the arrangement written by Elgar in 1922. It is said that King George V actually preferred it to God Save The King. The Commonwealth Games use it at medal ceremonies where the member countries of the UK are separately involved. It is now the official song of the English and Welsh Cricket Board, Rugby League Challenge Cup and Super League final. Politically it is sung at Labour Party conferences alongside The Red Flag. Probably its most famous annual appearance is as part of the Last Night of The Proms. It was introduced to the Proms by Sir Malcolm Sargent in the 1950s and sung with great gusto each year since then. Whatever Blake and Parry actually thought it represented, it is part of our culture, sporting and religious lives. Its opening chords command our attention, we recognise the melody, and we are moved by its grandeur and solemnity whatever the setting. A fitting second National anthem.

Recipe

Beef and Cider Casserole

Ingredients

- 2lb Ash House Braising Steak, diced
- 百 1 Onion, chopped
- 1 Red pepper, sliced
- 5 1/2lb Mushrooms, quartered
- 5 1/2 Pint of Tomato juice
- 1/2 1/3 pint Cider
- ☐ 2 tbsp Flour
- - Salt & Pepper



Method

- Coat meat in seasoned flour, heat oil in a non-stick frying pan, fry beef until browned well.
- Remove & place in a casserole dish. Fry onion & carrot, until starting to soften then add pepper and finally add mushrooms and fry lightly.
- Add the vegetables to the casserole along with the tomato juice.
- Deglaze the pan with some of the cider and add to the casserole along with the remaining cider to cover the mixture.
- Season with salt & pepper.

Cover and cook for 3 hours at 160C/300F or until the meat is very tender.

Bonus Recipe

Rhubarb Cake Pudding

This delicious recipe using early rhubarb is just right for cold January days.

Ingredients

Pudding

- ☐ 1 lb / 450 g early rhubarb

- ∑ 2 tablespoons water

For the Topping

- ∑ 2 oz / 50g butter
- a 2 oz / 50g caster sugar
- 1 egg



Method

- Add the sugar, grated orange rind and water. Set aside while preparing the topping.
- Sift flour and salt. Cream the butter and sugar until light, then gradually beat in the lightly mixed egg. Add a little of the flour along with the last few additions of egg, and then, using a metal spoon, fold in the remaining flour to make a medium soft consistency, Spoon the mixture over the rhubarb and spread evenly.
- ⇒ Place in the centre of a moderately hot oven (375 F, 190 C, gas mark 5) and bake for 35-40 minutes or until cake topping is well risen and golden brown.
 - Sprinkle with icing sugar and serve hot with cream or custard or ice cream.







