Dear Friends

[A Sabbath] Rest



August is often a month when regular activities stop, and life can, for a week or two, slow down at least a fraction.

I've been thinking about rest recently, partly because I had a few days holiday last month and partly because I was asked by a small group of school staff if they could have a quiet, meditative service after school. They recognised the need to be quiet and rest for a while.

I had very much hoped that one of the positive legacies of lockdown five years ago would be a willingness to slow life down a little. Clearly that hasn't happened, and, if anything life has sped up. And yet, at the heart of our human nature is the need to rest.

The most cursory reading of the accounts of creation in Genesis chapters 1 and 2 reveals that on the seventh day of creation, God rested. The need to rest is so important in the Jewish tradition, that the Jewish day begins with rest, starting at sundown. The creation accounts state that: 'It was evening and it was morning, that day'. There is something beautiful, and necessary, about the day starting with rest. The fourth of the Ten Commandments is a commandment to 'Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy', what that means in our hectic 24 hour society is for each of us to work out, but for our individual well being and mental health, it is important that we do grapple with what it means in our individual lives.

Finally, in the Letter to the Hebrews, the writer (whoever they may be), tells us that, 'There remains a sabbath rest for the people of God.' (Hebrews 4:9). In the context in which this verse sits, this can be read as a hint of the eternal rest which awaits all those who believe in Jesus.

Perhaps August, or at least a small portion of it, will have a glimpse of the rest for which we long because it is hard baked into our human nature.

The next meetings will be on August 7th and September 4th from 10-12 noon in Church. Everyone is very welcome to pop in for as little or as long as they wish.














Darnhall and Wettenhall WI




Eco Church

Favourite Hymns; For the Beauty of the Earth

August is usually associated with holidays, either at home, somewhere else in the UK or abroad. Most people look to visit or stay in a place that they consider 'beautiful', whether that is at the coast, the countryside, historic cities or simply by a cooling pool with a lounger. The Earth is a beautiful planet, despite all that has happened to it over millions of years. This beauty is celebrated in a well-loved hymn written by Folliot Sandford Pierpoint in 1864, when he was 29 years old. He was a well-educated graduate of Queen's College Cambridge, a teacher at Somersetshire College in his hometown of Bath, and a poet. He was a 'Tractarian' - a member of a religious revival group within the Church of England which looked back to its Catholic roots. Their beliefs were published in 'Tracts For the Times', which gave them their name. Folliot loved the natural World and is said to have written this hymn after sitting on the hills above Bath and looking at the countryside below. He went on to publish books of poetry, including 'The Chalice of Nature' and 'Songs of Love'.

'For The Beauty of the Earth' reflects on the beauty of hills, streams and sky and our place in this World. It also brings in our close family relationships and connections with God. The hymn was originally written as a Eucharistic hymn, meaning that it was to be used at Holy Communion services, which is why the phrase 'this our sacrifice of praise' is included in the verses. Psalm 19 has similar themes, and both remind us that nature has a repeating rhythm with the order of the four seasons and day following night.

The original melody was written by Conrad Kocher in 1838 as a chorale tune for the hymn 'Faithful Saviour, We Are Here'. This melody was then adapted by William Monk, although it is usually

known as 'Dix' after William Chatterton Dix. He used it for his Christmas carol 'As With Gladness Men Of Old' and the name stuck! Originally there were eight verses, but these were reduced to four or five over the decades. One of the most popular melodies for the hymn is now David Evans tune known as' Lucerna Laudonine ', although John Rutter wrote a truly lovely setting in 1980. At the time Rutter said that he 'wrote the melody and it was nice that it had a sense of being inevitable - you can't imagine it having been written in any other way. 'If you are not familiar with this version, then it's well worth looking it up on YouTube because it is beautiful in itself. Whatever the melody, this hymn is published in over 450 hymnals around the World, different countries and religious groups adapting it slightly to reflect their beliefs. It seems to have universal themes which are accessible to all. It is a particular favourite for American Thanksgiving celebrations, which show just how far it has travelled since the City of Bath in the 19th Century. Wherever you are for August, have a break from routine, if only to listen to this hymn.

Act Now

Strange instructions

This is a very good example of a Smishing (SMS fishing) message. Please be careful with all text messages and emails you receive, Cyber Crime is not going away anytime soon.

According to DWP records: You have not yet submitted your application for Winter Heating Allowance 2025-2026. To ensure you receive your £300 payment, please complete your application before 9 July 2025.

Failure to submit an application by the deadline will render you inclinible for the stipend.

Contacting the emergency services if you are Deaf or Hard of hearing

If you struggle to hear someone on the phone, then getting help in an emergency could be difficult, however you can now contact the emergency services via a text message, but you MUST register your phone beforehand. What to do:-

- 1. Register your phone Text the word 'register' to 999
- 2. You will get an automatic reply please read it.
- 3. Reply to the message saying 'yes'
- 4. You will then get a text telling you your mobile is now registered.

In an emergency you can now text 999 - type which service you require and brief details of the emergency and where you are.

It was fantastic to see so many pupils pushing themselves, trying new things, and showing excellent sportsmanship throughout the week.










