From the Manger to the Cross

Some years ago I attended an event at Ely Cathedral to mark the Festival of Candlemas. The Cathedral was filled with literally thousands of candles as we marked the day when Mary and Joseph went to the Temple to present the 40-day old Jesus, as Jewish Law required.

The proper name for that festival might be The Presentation of Christ in the Temple, but for centuries in this country, it has been known as Candlemas. A reminder, on the final day of the Christmas Season, that 40 days after Christmas Day, the light still shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it, not even as we leave Christmas behind and begin, in the cold, dark days of February, to move towards Lent and our journey to the cross.

In a world which feels increasingly unstable and uncertain, as we move away from Christmas, we need to take the light we discovered shining in the darkness around the manger out into the world. As we move towards Lent (which starts on 18th February), we need to walk towards the cross, confident that travelling the way of the cross will give us strength in the challenges and uncertainties of life. More than that, we can travel confident that, beyond the cross, lies the light of the resurrection.

Yours in the light of Christ as we travel from the manger to the cross.

Acton Christmas Concert

A festive Christmas concert featuring the acclaimed chamber choir Concordia filled St Mary's Church on Monks Lane in Acton, near Nantwich, on Saturday 13th December 2025.

Titled A Little Christmas with Concordia, the event delighted audiences with a varied programme of seasonal favourites, performed in the atmospheric setting of the Grade I listed church. A seasonal hamper raffle also gave concert-goers the chance to support St Mary's.

Concordia was formed in the summer of 2020, when a small group of singers met outdoors to sing in a socially distanced way during the pandemic. Since then, the choir has grown into a much-loved local ensemble, praised for its uplifting harmonies. The choir is led by musical director Alison Phillips, with John Gough on piano.

The first half featured works by John Rutter, Kerensa Briggs and Eric Whitacre, alongside traditional carols. After refreshments, Concordia returned with popular festive classics including Silent Night and Hark the Herald Angels Sing.

Adding to the festive atmosphere were 28 decorated trees from the church's Storybook Christmas Tree Festival. Proceeds from the evening will support the ongoing preservation of St Mary's Church.





Advent to Candlemas at Messy Church



Archbishops Of Canterbury: St. Augustine – the first

Roman Britain had three Christian archbishops in London, York and Caerleon [near modern Newport]. However, the invasion of Anglo-Saxons in the 5th and 6th centuries resulted in a return to paganism, with only a few native Christians remaining, mainly in the Western areas of England and supported by missionaries from Ireland. All this changed with the arrival of a prior from the Abbey of St. Andrew in Rome, Augustine. He was sent here on a mission by Pope Gregory the Great to rekindle the Christian faith and arrived by ship at Ebbsfleet in Thanet, Kent, in 597 AD. He was accompanied by Lawrence [his eventual successor in Canterbury] and a team of monks, teachers and translators. He travelled to Canterbury, and was quickly accepted by King Ethelbert, a major leader of Anglo Saxon Kings, whose wife Bertha was a Frankish Christian princess. Canterbury had a Christian church which had been established by the Romans, which Augustine re-consecrated following its use as a pagan place of worship. [Its remains were uncovered in an archaeological dig in 1973.] He founded the monastery of St. Peter and St. Paul, which later became St. Augustine's Abbey. This lies close to Canterbury Cathedral to the southern side. Ever since then the Archbishops of Canterbury have been said to occupy the Chair of St. Augustine. It became known as the mother church of all England until the dissolution of the Catholic church and the death of the last Catholic Archbishop, Archbishop Pole, in 1558.

Pope Gregory had originally planned for two Archbishops for England – London and York, however, Augustine's success in Canterbury led to it becoming Canterbury and York, with Canterbury the more senior. Augustus sent Lawrence back to Pope Gregory to clarify issues for his growing church. Little seems to have changed over the centuries because the questions included those of

church organisation, guidance on who is allowed to marry whom, childbirth and baptism and the lawful celebration of Mass. Gregory advised that Canterbury and York should each have 12 junior Bishops to advance the spread of the church. Meanwhile thousands of people were being baptised by Augustine, said to be 10,000 on Christmas Day 597AD alone! Other Roman missionaries arrived in 601AD and by 604AD new bishops were ordained in London and Rochester, alongside the establishment of a school to train Anglo-Saxon priests and missionaries. Aware of the need to protect the continuation of the new churches, Augustine arranged for the consecration of his successor Lawrence. On 26th May 604 AD Augustine died and was buried in the church now known as St. Augustine's in Canterbury. He was later exhumed and reburied in Abbey Church, which became a place of pilgrimage. After the Norman Conquest [1066] a cult grew up around St. Augustine and King Henry I of England granted Canterbury a six day fair [8 – 13th September] to commemorate the time of reburial in the Abbey Church. Unfortunately, in the time of the Reformation of the church by Henry VIII, the shrine was destroyed and the relics lost. St. Augustine had established the role of the Archbishop of Canterbury so strongly that it survived the upheaval of the Reformation and remains the centre of the Church of England and a place of pilgrimage today.

Revd (Canon) John Malbon

It was with great sadness that we heard of the death of Revd John Malbon on 22 December.

John, together with Janet, became part of the Cross Country Parishes when John retired, around 25 years ago.

Unlike many retired clergy, who take services across a wide area, John committed himself to the Cross Country Parishes, taking services and being involved in activities across the benefice until his death.

In late September, John celebrated 60 years of ordained ministry as a Deacon and 59 years as a Priest. It was a joy to mark this milestone with John at the Harvest Service in Acton in early October.

It was at this point, that John took the decision not to renew his Permission to Officiate, and took his final service on a Wednesday morning at the end of September. John has touched the lives of many people during his long life and ministry. One of those people was Bishop Andy Emerton, Bishop of Sherwood, who spoke of John's ministry in his sermon at an Ordination Service in Southwell Minster in July last year. Another colleague, on hearing of John's death, spoke of him as "The Saint of the Chester Diocese."

Even as we miss John's wise and gentle presence amongst us, we are thankful that he is now rejoicing at the heavenly banquet in the presence of the God he loved and served.

Our love and prayers are with Janet and John's family at this time.




In PE, we have started a new topic on gymnastics. The children are exploring different ways of moving, balancing and travelling, and are already showing great enthusiasm and teamwork.

St Oswald's C.E Primary School Worleston

Last term, our school was delighted to welcome families from across the local area to our spectacular Science Fair. The staff at St Oswald's Primary School planned and delivered a fully interactive and engaging event which showcased our school as a welcoming hub of learning and community. We were thrilled to welcome 67 families in total, including 34 families who were new to our school, giving many their first opportunity to experience the vibrant learning environment we are so proud of.

The Science Fair was a wonderful celebration of how we learn at our school and the strong links we have with our wider community. Families explored six exciting activity bases, each offering hands-on STEM experiences designed to spark curiosity and wonder. Children worked alongside parents to make volcanoes and lava lamps, test and experiment with magnets, and explore how forces work by launching rockets into the air—carefully adjusting angles and force to achieve the best results.

We were also delighted to welcome community partners who helped make the event so special. Mad Science brought high-energy demonstrations, while local company Gootopia entertained children by creating all sorts of weird and wonderful slimes to take home. 




